



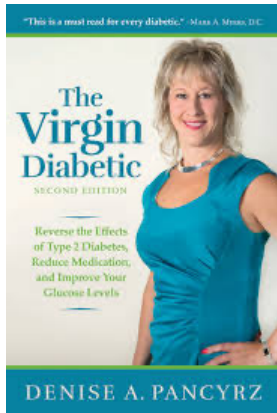


## Rotary provides \$20 million to help communities worldwide respond to COVID-19
